

Creating an Interactive PowerPoint Video

Primary Sources: actual materials that have survived from the past, such as letters, photographs, articles of clothing.

Secondary sources: accounts of the past created by people writing about events sometime after they happened.

American Memory

In groups, you will develop **4 PowerPoint slides** using primary sources to describe an event during World War II. All slides will be grouped together to create a class Interactive PowerPoint Video.

Requirements:

- Slides 1-3:
 - 3 Primary Source Documents (1 slide for each)
 - American Memory (Link from the LMC web page)
 - 1 from a print source
 - 1 from either American Memory, print source, or selected link
- Description of event, etc. about each source (See below.)

- Slide 4:
 - Choose any of the following:
 - Multimedia clip (Quicktime video, etc.) – *see LMC webpage, Research Topics, for specific information*
 - Audio clip (Real Audio, etc.)
 - Speech or letter
 - Statistics
 - Other?

- Cite your sources using the Citation Machine.
